



Comprehensive Training in Parenteral Moderate Sedation

Overview

Course format is both didactic and clinical. Training includes basic moderate (conscious) sedation, including administration of parenteral sedative medications to a minimum of 20 patients; physical evaluation; management of medical emergencies in a clinical simulation experience on human patient simulators; monitoring and the use of monitoring equipment. A required session on Advanced Cardiac Life Support is included. Discussion includes pharmacology of utilized agents, recommendations for situational drug selection, various IV fluids and venipuncture techniques. This is not a residency in general anesthesia; you will not be trained to “put people to sleep.” This course meets or exceeds ADA standards for parenteral moderate sedation.

Objectives

- 1) See a minimum of 20 patients
- 2) Start IVs on each case
- 3) Titrate drug to effect for each patient
- 4) Perform dental procedures on sedated patients
- 5) Upon satisfactory completion of this course, participants may take the Oregon Board of Dentistry and most other states to administer parenteral moderate sedation.

Prerequisites

- 1) A valid license to practice dentistry in the United States.
- 2) Temporary Oregon dental license, for out-of-state participants. OAGD will assist with the process.
- 3) A current permit to prescribe and administer controlled substances issued by the DEA.
- 4) A current CPR Level C card (Basic Life Support). The BLS card must be health care provider level.
- 5) Appropriate professional malpractice insurance.

June 2012 – Intensive Option:

This course will be offered in Portland, Oregon over a two-week period June 18 – 26, 2011 with two clinic sessions to choose from June 27-30, 2012 or July 5- 8, 2012.
