



**Emergencies in the Sedated Patient

Overview

This unique and challenging program provides a clinical simulation experience that addresses the proper assessment and management of complications associated with IV moderate sedation and general anesthesia. Following a brief introduction explaining essential principles, participants will demonstrate appropriate patient management on human patient simulators. (Laerdal SimMan).

Objectives:

- Describe and demonstrate appropriate components of an adequate primary assessment.
- Discuss various anatomical and pathologic causes of airway obstruction and demonstrate their recognition and appropriate management.
- Describe and demonstrate the recognition and appropriate management of respiratory depression, distinguishing it from airway obstruction.
